




Indicators of area deprivation, 2011 Census

The Indices of Deprivation 2015, due to be published in September, will provide a view of area deprivation in England which has not been updated for five years. In advance of this we look here at six indicators of low income or deprivation from the 2011 Census. These simplified maps identify which small areas of the city were among the top 10% and top 20% of areas in England with the highest concentration of these indicators. 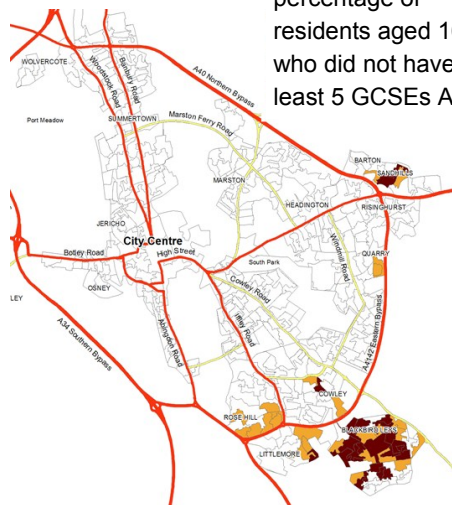

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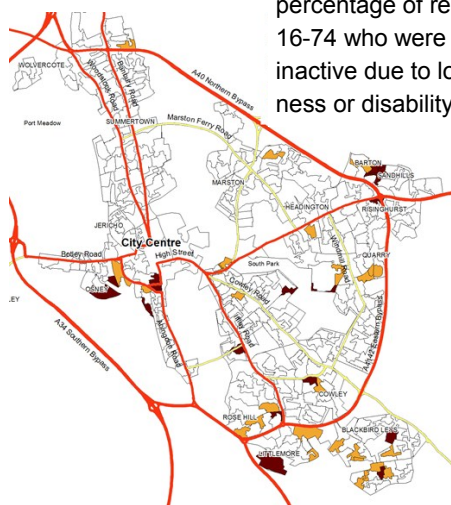
Low qualifications

percentage of residents aged 16-74 who did not have at least 5 GCSEs A-C



Sickness or disability

percentage of residents aged 16-74 who were economically inactive due to long-term sickness or disability



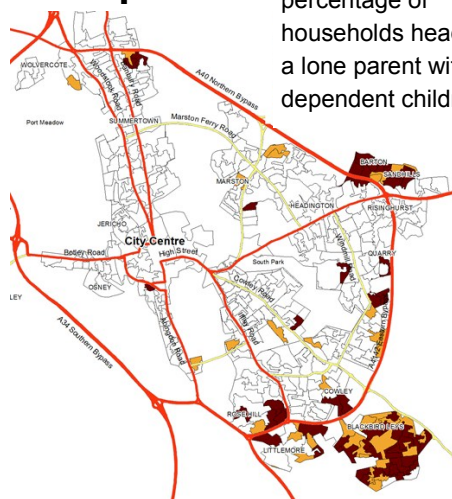
Unemployment

percentage of residents aged 16-74 who reported being unemployed



Lone parents

percentage of households headed by a lone parent with dependent children



Social housing

percentage of households who rented their home from the council or a housing association



Low pay occupations

percentage of adults aged 16-74 who were classed in either semi-routine, routine or never worked/long-term unemployed socio-economic classes
