	AS will write a report to ask if we can extend the deadline.	AS
	Future expenditure will include renting space in the centre for an open consultation and	

	having a stall at Headington Festival.	
	We might have to pay out for an Environmental Impact Assessment.	
	FM will liaise with RB to work out a budget for this year once funds have been sorted out	
	with Headington Action.	FM
	The paperwork for the Bank Account has been lodged and we await a cheque book.	
4.	CIL money	
	We wish to ascertain from the City Council the mechanism for getting CIL money for the	MR/AS
	Plan.	
	One of the largest tranches should come from the Old Road Campus site.	
	We will liaise with Oxford Civic Society Neighbourhood Plan representative (Richard	MR/RB
	Bradley) to organise a joint approach to the city with the other local plans.	
5.	Character & Identity – Assessment workshops	
	One of two assessment workshops has already taken place. There are 19 areas to	
	consider.	
	Draft assessments are to be done by the end of February with a view to putting them out	
	for public consultation in March – the actual mechanism for this to be discussed.	
6.	Parish Council	
	We need to debate the pros and cons of setting up a Parish Council at some stage.	
	Would the City Council want this?	
	Could it succeed the Forum or should the latter continue as the monitoring body for the	
	agreed Plan?	
	We will do a SWOT analysis (Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities, Threats)	MR
	The point of a Parish Council is that it allows "communities to take control of local assets,	
	deliver local services and influence decision-making and priorities" (Rural Services Network – Stephen Williams 13/1/15). New legislation "will allow neighbourhood forums to	
	trigger a community governance review for a new parish council without requiring them to	
	submit a petition".	
7.	Planning	
	As mentioned in the last minutes, we will consider the requirement for something along the	
	lines of the Oxford Design Panel which is scrutinising planning applications in the city.	
	Large developments do not fit in to our existing PWGs – should we create a new group to	
	look at large developments? A meeting of all local Councillors might be useful to discuss	MR
<u> </u>	this.	
8.	Drainage	
	There are problems of pollution emanating from the Churchill Hospital and affecting the	
	Lye Valley and Boundary Brook.	
	All new development in Headington puts a strain on the drainage system eg. Latimer Road	
	where there will be c.200 new bathrooms in the flats.	
	We would like to have a drainage/water system assessment done for Headington so that	
	any new developments have to take account of their findings.	
	Whilst talking to the City regarding a possible Strategic Environmental Assessment	AS/MR
	inclusion in our Plan we can ask about this too.	
9.	Headington Forward	

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	The common problem experienced by the institutions is the traffic which causes delays to	
	staff getting to work and students getting to college.	
	Hitherto the County have been talking to the individual institutions, but it was decided at	
	the last HF meeting that we would organise a joint meeting of the institutions and the	
	County to work out a possible joined up solution (like transport sharing).	
	This meeting is on Monday 16 February – venue and time to be advised.	
	We expect the move from Brookes Wheatley to Headington to be raised and will ask for a	
	Community Engagement Strategy plan from Brookes to address the ensuing traffic	
	implications. The transfer will amount to 2,500 students and 400 staff.	
	We will need to assess how this is represented in the HNP.	
	There will be some new buildings on the Headington campus and we need to find out what	
	CIL monies might come our way from this development.	
	There is also some new building planned on the Marston Road site for student	
	accommodation and we will want to know how many students will be coming.

	The format of the meeting will commence with an update from each PWG chair.	
	(A pre meeting of PWG chairs during the week before is being arranged to discuss
